Weekly Reflection.

'The Hills of Connemara'

'The Hills of Connemara' is a folk song I remember from my childhood which the old people would sing on their ceilidhs, which recounted Ireland's propensity for the brewing of poitin and the fear of the excise men who could interrupt this illicit activity. There is a phrase in the song when despite the vigilance of the lookouts, the worst has happened and the net has closed in on the still; 'Stand your ground, you are too late.'#

This expression was given many outings by my father on all sorts of occasions, as when we as children showed the inadequacy or ineptness of our trying to turn an animal back as it made a burst for freedom, or when the school bus had disappeared around the bend in the road without us onboard, or the stylish corner-forward made eejits of our defending.

Jesus is using a similar type of expression today when He urges us to bear witness to him despite provocations, or threats or even betrayal. 'Stand your ground for I will give you a wisdom and an eloquence that none of your opponents will be able to resist or contradict.'

Following Christ puts us at odds with much of our society, but standing firm in face of ridicule and condemnation may well win us our lives.
