### **Weekly Reflection.**

#### Pope Francis, our holy Father.

From his first moment at the window in St Peter's when he said 'Buona sera' (Good evening), to his final blessing there on Sunday with his last words 'Buona Pasqua' (Happy Easter) Pope Francis truly was our holy Father. Many people could see in Francis a wise and generous, almost grandfather-like figure, who having lived a life of witness and dedication to the joy of the Gospel, could be depended on to provide sage and wise words of counsel and advice, to anyone with ears to hear. To our church he was the pastor who cared for his flock. To the world he was a powerful voice which challenged corruption and violence and power seeking. When he visited Lampedusa, early in his papacy he shone a spotlight on the plight of the poor, African refugees, men, women and children, whose bodies were being washed ashore there, hopelessly striving to find a better life in a Europe who tried to ignore their plight. With his 2015 encyclical Laudato Si, he turned the spotlight on the environment disaster that threatens to overwhelm our very existence, but which the western world prefers to pretend is not happening. With righteous anger he has begged forgiveness for the clerical child abuse which has damaged the lives of so many and undermined the wholesome mission of the church.

When he visited Ireland in 2018 it was not to be feted by the high and mighty in Dublin, but to the down and out in the Capuchin day Centre, that he made his way. When challenged about the church's harsh condemnation of those who cannot fit into a narrow, rigid, simplistic code of behaviour, he famously replied, "Who am I to judge?'

Francis saw the church not as an institution to be defended, but as a community, a family where we all belong regardless of our faults and limitations. His moral leadership was based on empathy, tolerance, humility, and inclusiveness. He accepted his role as an 'alto Christus' while bringing other faith leaders along as co-workers for the Kingdom. His directness and simplicity, humility, and joy, were based on his genuine belief that the Hope of the Gospel, could never be extinguished and would bring us all together towards a better world.

Francis had a powerful devotion to Our Lady, and in the words of the Magnificat he may have found his vocation both in church and in the world, to 'pull the mighty from their thrones, and to raise up the lowly.' His profound theology was simply the Love of God, the Joy of the Gospel. Like St. Paul he can now say, 'I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith.' May the Gates of Paradise now open to receive his gentle soul.
