#### **Weekly Reflection.**

#### The Exaltation of The Holy Cross.

Each year on the 14<sup>th</sup> September (today) the Church celebrates the feast of The Exaltation of The Cross - often times referred to as the Triumph of the Cross.

When we look on the cross of Jesus with the eyes of faith, we don't simply see the tragic ending of a good man's life. We behold what Paul called the power and wisdom of God, the power of a love greater than any human love, the love spoken about in today's gospel reading. 'God so loved the world that he gave his only Son'.

While we are the beneficiaries of the triumph of God's love on Calvary, our own lives can also reveal to others the triumph of the cross. The triumph of the cross shows itself in all kinds of ways, in the tolerance and humour we show to each other against all odds, in the willingness to let go of old hurts, in the bearing of terminal illness with patience and dignity, in the fidelity to significant commitments when they become costly, in the loving service that endures even when it is not appreciated. We pray on this feast that the triumph of the cross would continue to take flesh in all of our lives.
