"The Wedding Garment"

The parable of the wedding feast is a symbol of the Kingdom of Heaven. The first group who were invited were too busy to attend. The second group rejected the invitation with violence. Those who eventually turned up were a mixed bag of rejects and homeless people whom society despised.

The message for us is fairly clear. God invites us to share in his Kingdom – but some of us "do not have time", others reject the invitation with scorn and disrespect. Then the rest of us turn up – but not always prepared to make much of an effort; - then we are like the guest who turns up without the wedding garment – our obligation in attending the Kingdom is to at least have the wedding garment. What is the wedding garment? It is our good works.

Angel Plot: Over the past two years wonderful work has been ongoing in St Joseph's Cemetery to prepare an Angel Plot. This plot will remember those still-born babies and infants who died before baptism, who in the past were not buried in consecrated grounds in the graveyards. This was during a time when the Church was cold and insensitive to the plight of such babies and their parents and families. While we cannot undo the hurts of the past, we can make good our respect and reverence for all who were so buried. The Angel Plot will be consecrated in a special ceremony on Sunday 5th November after the 12 noon Mass, (approx 1.15pm). This liturgy will represent all those infants who were still-born and babies who died without baptism, for whatever reason, and who are buried anywhere in our cemetery. Everyone is invited to attend and give thanks to God for the gifts of our angels.

"Hearts on Fire, Feet on the Move" (Luke 24: 13-35). World Mission Sunday is the Holy Father's annual appeal for spiritual and financial support so that the life-giving work of overseas mission and missionaries can continue. It always falls on the second last Sunday in October, meaning this year it will be celebrated over the weekend of Sunday 22nd October. The theme for this year's celebration of Mission Sunday is: "Hearts on Fire, Feet on the Move" (Luke 24: 13-35). Right now, missionaries desperately need your help. In many poorer parishes in Africa, Asia, and Latin America missionaries are serving on the front line. They already do so much, walking hand-in-hand with marginalised communities, long before and after any emergency. You can show missionaries you care by supporting World Mission Sunday. Your prayers and generosity will change lives.
