#### Weekly Reflection.

#### **Prayer and Mission**

Today, the church celebrates Mission Sunday, a day dedicated to reminding us of our missionary mandate as a church. It entails bringing the Good News of Christ to the ends of the earth. The best way to do this is by being Christians. Being Christian is an identity, a character or quality of a person and not necessarily a religion. For instance, to say someone is beautiful is to attribute a quality to the person. In the same way, to say that one is a Christian is to say something about the person's quality, identity or character, and that character is the character of Christ. For this reason, mission Sunday is a call on us to live fully the character of Christ in our society. We are not to carry words on our lips so much as to have or live an identity.

Our readings today tell us that perseverance in prayer should be the identity of the Christian in a world where injustice, corruption, hate and violence reign. Prayer should be our weapon amid these crises. The Lord's words should be our inspiration: "Pay attention to what the dishonest judge says! Will not God then secure the rights of his chosen ones who call out to him day and night?
