Weekly Reflection.

A Questioning Spirit.

A questioning spirit is in no way alien to a life of faith. Indeed, faith will always generate questions, especially the kind of question to which there is no definitive answer. In the Gospels, people of faith address all kinds of questions to Jesus. We have an example of such questioning at the beginning of today's Gospel reading. Someone comes up to Jesus and asks him, 'Sir, will there be only a few saved?' Jesus' response to this question suggests that God's embrace is much wider than we could conceive. Saint Paul expresses this truth in his own way when he speaks of 'the breadth and length and height and depth' of the love of God revealed in Jesus.

The question of suffering, in particular that of innocent people, such as children with a life-threatening or terminal illness, is a mystery to which there is no simple answer, if indeed there is any answer at all. Facile comments such as 'It's God's will,' or 'Offer it up' are of little help. Only someone who has experienced a serious setback can truly understand: all anyone else can do is to listen to them talk about it so that they can make some sense of their life and what it could mean. Perhaps again, the words of Saint Paul offer the best in terms of an answer to the question of suffering when he speaks of 'the breadth and length and height and depth' of the love of God revealed in Jesus.

DAY OF PRAYER AND REFLECTION FOR GAZA - TODAY, SUNDAY 24th AUGUST 2025.

Bishop Larry Duffy, in joining with Archbishop Eamon Martin of Armagh, has invited parishioners in all parishes across Clogher Diocese to make this day, Sunday August 24th, a Day of Prayer and Reflection for Gaza. This will unite us in prayer with people in parishes all across Ireland today.

Here in the parish of Machaire Rois, the Weekly Sunday Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will take place in St. Joseph's Church - **but today Sunday, August 24**th, **it will be in the main body of the Church,** with the Blessed Sacrament Exposed on the Altar **after the conclusion of the 12noon Mass.** The Silent Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will continue throughout the afternoon, concluding with **Prayers of Reflection and Benediction between 5.15pm & 6pm.**

Parishioners are strongly encouraged, where possible, to come and spend some time this afternoon in prayerful solidarity with the suffering people of Gaza and in praying for a renewed commitment by the international community for a just and lasting peace in the Middle East.

Prayerful solidarity with the people of Gaza at this time can take the form of: Attending Mass (any day) and offering it for peace in Gaza - Spending time in Adoration before the Blessed Sacrament - Praying the Rosary for peace and justice - Lighting a candle at home on in your local church - Making a small personal sacrifice or act of penance - Reaching out to your political representatives to advocate for justice and humanitarian aid - Supporting trusted aid organisations bringing relief to Gaza - or by showing solidarity in whatever way we can.

Archbishop Martin, in the name of the Church the length and breadth of Ireland, concluded his pastoral letter (copies available beside the weekly parish Newsletter) with these words: "This is a moment for our nation to radiate the light of Christ into the darkness, a light of peace, of justice and of hope for our world. Let us stand together, as one body in Christ, for the people of Gaza and for all who long for a just and lasting peace in the Holy Land."
