Weekly Reflection.

Blessed are those who have not lost hope.

A parable is literally defined as "something placed alongside." By placing one object next to another, we can teach a lesson that can be inferred from the similarities or differences between the two objects. In today's gospel parable, the focus is on contrast rather than resemblance. Jesus asks, "How much more will God, who is a loving Father, meet all his children's needs if a rude and mean-spirited person can ultimately be forced into giving by a friend's shameless persistence?" "If you, who are evil, know that you are bound to supply your children's needs, how much more will God? Therefore, the lesson of this story is not that we should keep praying or knocking on an unwilling God's door until we finally force him to grant us what we desire, but that we are going in hope to a father whose heart is full of abundant love for us and who understands our needs better than we do. We are knocking not to annoy, but because of our hope that our father sees and knows everything.

This year, which is a Jubilee Year of Hope, is also a Jubilee for the Catholic Grandparents and Elderly Association. Hope placed in the Lord is the true way to the Christian's blessedness and a reconciled old age. As we reflect on the theme of hope, let us also reflect on how the presence of grandparents and the elderly can be a sign of hope in every family and church community.

World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly: The elderly are signs of hope and witnesses of blessedness. The first Message of Pope Leo XIV for the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, whose fifth edition will be celebrated today Sunday, 27 July 2025, the theme of the message is "Blessed are those who have not lost hope (Sir 14:2)" and fits into the context of the Jubilee of Hope 2025. In the Message, the Holy Father invites us to recognise the elderly not only as recipients of pastoral care, but as witnesses of hope who are active protagonists in the life of the Church. Old age can be a time of blessedness in which hope, tested in the fire of a long life, becomes a source of joy and renewed trust in the Lord. God "teaches us that, in his eyes, old age is a time of blessing and grace, and that the elderly are, for him, the first witnesses of hope.' states Pope Leo XIV in his Message.
